AGENDA ITEM 4-CAPTAINS REPORT.

I would like to start saying what an honour and a privilege it has been to be your Captain for 2017. It would have been impossible to fulfil my duties as Captain without the support I have received from my wife Maureen, Vice Captain Peter Zammit the other six members of the committee, Thank you one and all.

This year saw the completion of John Spooner's project, the Half Way House. We hopefully now have a facility that all members of the club can and will make use of and provided it is looked after will be able to do so for many years to come.

Now on to the Section itself, we've had 133 paid up members and regularly see 50+ of them turn out on a Tuesday or Thursday. Forty-five of them have also represented the club in our season of friendly matches against 13 other clubs in Lincs, Notts, Rutland and Cambridgeshire. We played 25 matches last year achieving 13 wins 8 losses and 4 halved matches. A big thank you to all of you for giving up what is a full day at a time to represent our club and achieving results of which as your Captain I am suitably proud.

In our major open competitions this year we have seen 400+ players, from around 40 different clubs, take part and help us to raise over £1600 to support club projects and £2220 for my charity which is the Lincolnshire Emergency Medical Response team.

A big thank you here to my wife Maureen, Jane Eales and Lorraine Gilbert for their valuable assistance. Also a very special thank you to Helen Kirschner and the Ladies Section for providing the wonderful cakes at the HWH. My thanks also go to John Spooner for his organising of the Seniors Open.

As I said this time last year it was my intention to have a Senior Captain's project fund using money raised internally to support this rather than donating all to charity. This has proved very successful and to date we, that is you, have raised just over £2800, £940 of it from the Water Jar. My main project was to finish the work I started in my year as Club Captain and refurbish the entrance foyer to match the main bar/dining room area. This has now been done at a cost of £1800. My thanks in completing this work must go to Neil Gilbert who has once again done all the construction work and project managed everything including his 2 little helpers Pete Zammit & myself. I have also spent £264 on 2 new tables for the dining room plus other smaller purchases to support the club..

For my Captains Day this year we experimented with a shotgun start for the first time. This proved extremely successful as we had most of the 76 players who took part still in the clubhouse at the end for the presentation of The Dave Keates Memorial Trophy to Martin Coleman. Thank you again to Maureen for providing the refreshments at the HWH where she was assisted by Rita Swift and Yvonne Williams.

My thanks go also to Pat Stewart for once again providing the bottle of whisky for the Clock Putting competition which was won for the second year on the trot by Richard Attwell. Pat has indicated that this was to be his last year in sponsoring this competition so Richard Attwell has agreed to take it over from this year's event. Thank you Pat for what I believe is 6 years of sponsorship.

My thanks also to Alan Moore for providing the bottle of malt to go with his trophy for 'nearest the pin on 14' on Club champs day.

A special thanks from all of the Senior Section to Peter and Tracey Chamberlain for all their help and support over the past year. I'm sure Pete must wake up on Tuesday and Thursday mornings and think 'Oh no' not that lot again. But sincerely Pete we do appreciate everything you do for us.

Finally my thanks go to two particular groups of club staff. Firstly the Greens Staff who are out at first light in all weathers to ensure our course is always presented to a very high standard. This last season has probably seen it at its best ever. Thank you also to all the club members who give of their own time to assist in the course maintenance. Secondly to our catering and bar staff who never fail to keep us well fed and watered. The match meals and open day meals have again been excellent. So much so that we are the envy of many of the other clubs we play. These are the words of many a visiting captain, not mine. Also to Avril for running the HWH for us on a Thursday. To this end I earlier wrote to the chair of the Catering and the Greens Committees to personally express my thanks for all that they have done to ensure our year was a resounding success.

In closing I would like to wish Peter Zammit every success for his year as Captain which commences next week. I am sure you will all give him the same support as you have given me this year. Thank you.

AGENDA ITEM 6 – TREASURER'S REPORT

The Section has enjoyed yet another very successful year with 133 members, the same as last year, although average numbers actually playing on a Tuesday and Thursday is down quite significantly on last year.

Successful events in raising funds again this year were the Seniors Open Day and the end of season Invitation Day which raised a combined total of £1096.07. Also for the first time this year we took over the finances of the Seniors AM-AM which raised a further £566.75. In keeping with previous years this profit, £1662.82, was donated to the our SKGC Club Project fund. This profit continues to rise due to the popularity of the events.

The ratio of weekly subs to that paid out in prizes this year was 72%. This does not include the Winter League which ultimately pays back in prizes 100% of that paid in subs. Over and above this we subsidised our major functions to the tune of £1086

The balance of our Club Project fund stood at £1996.93 at the end of the year. The final cost of the new Half Way House was £5277.91. Other money spent on club projects amounted to £791.

The General fund currently stands at £570, which means that after 11 years as treasurer we have finally got this to what I consider to be a reasonable level.

Copies of the audited Income and Expenditure account for the past year have been circulated and if anyone has any questions I will gladly try to answer them.

Can I please have a proposer and seconder that the I&E account is accepted by you the members.

The I&E Account was proposed as a true record by Pete Sivill, seconded by Stew Milner and accepted by all present.

Before I close I thought you might all be interested in an update the information I gave you last year on donations to Charity and to Club projects. That is since I first became treasurer in 2007 as a section we have donated £45874 to charity and spent £17803 on various club projects and improvements, including the new HWH and the recent Foyer refurbishment. That is a tremendous achievement, so on behalf of all our Captains over these years thank you to each and every one of you for your support.

AGENDA ITEM 7 – APPOINTMENT OF CAPTAIN

It was proposed by John Spooner and seconded by Bill Dark that Pete Zammit be appointed captain for the next 12 months (2018/19).

The motion as carried unanimously by the members.

AGENDA ITEM 8 – APPOINTMENT OF VICE CAPTAIN

It was proposed by John Spooner and seconded by Martin Howard that Gerry Newby be appointed Vice Captain for the next 12 months (2018/19).

The motion was carried unanimously.

AGENDA ITEM 9 – APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

Secretary

It was proposed by John Spooner and seconded by Bill Dark that Martin Howard be appointed Secretary for the next 12 months (2018/19).

The motion was carried unanimously.

Treasurer

Bill Dark said that he is quite happy to carry on as treasurer; this position was proposed by Martin Howard and seconded by Colin Underwood.

The motion was carried unanimously.

Committee Members

Cliff Smith felt he was unable to continue as a committee member for the next year.

The remaining members that were serving on the Committee last year expressed that they would like to carry on. This was put to the floor and voted by the members unanimously.

Pete Williams observed that pitch marks are not repaired on both the aprons and the ain greens and this makes the problems worse.

Richard Attwell observed that 'teeing off' could be speeded up during the winter to prevent players waiting around for too long in the cold.

Terry Regan offered a vote of thanks to all the committee members and this was supported by all present.

Alan Broom stated that the Seniors' Pairs Trophy no longer has the word 'Seniors' on it and suggested that this should be re-instated.

Bill Dark raised the question of the Presentation Night being so poorly subscribed that it had to be cancelled. The crystal mementos for 2017 will be presented after the March Medal. He asked whether the members wanted to retain crystal mementos as they are now or to change to High Street vouchers to be presented on the day?

Steve Clifton stated that he thought the crystal was a long lasting reminder of achievements whereas vouchers would be soon forgotten.

Alistair Grant asked why the Presentation Night was so poorly subscribed. Bill was unable to answer that question.

The overriding opinion was that the crystal mementoes should be retained.

Allan Williams asked whether the crystal could be presented of the day of the competition. It was pointed out that it is often the case that trophy winners have gone by the time the field are all back in the clubhouse.

Bill Dark then briefed that this year, the Christmas Hamper Competition would be a 'shotgun start', with mince pies, mulled wine etc. As everyone would be in the clubhouse together afterwards the crystal presentation will take place then.

Colin Clark asked whether more competitions with a 'shotgun start' would be possible. Mel Moxon added that he felt this option should be investigated. The committee will look into which competitions, if any, would be suitable and then discuss with the Club Management committee.
