AGENDA ITEM 6 – TREASURER'S REPORT

The Section has enjoyed yet another very successful year with 125 members and has regularly seen 50+ of them turning out on a Tuesday and Thursday.

Successful events in raising funds for the Section this year were the Seniors Open Day and the end of season Invitation Day. As in previous years the profits were transferred to our SKGC Club fund to help improve facilities both in the club house and on the course. Our major purchase this year, at a cost of £2148, was a flail to fit on the tractor. The benefits of this are very apparent when you see how the green staff have been able to keep the rough areas around the course looking so neat and tidy.

The overall operating cost of the fund for the year shows a loss of £340. This is mainly due to the loss of play because of the wet weather early in the year and the increase in cost of prizes and engraving. The cost of trophies and engraving has risen from £800 in 2015 to almost £1000 this year. I have been a member of the section for almost 14 years and in that time entry fees have remained at £1.50/£2. Unfortunately if we wish to continue operating as we do then I'm afraid this

will have to change. Hence I shall be proposing later that we increase entry fees by 50p a day.

The ratio of weekly subs to that paid out in prizes this year was 76%. This does not include the Winter League which ultimately pays back in prizes 100% of that paid in subs.

The balance of our SKGC Club fund currently stands at £2137.35 although the committee have agreed to spend some of this on two picnic type benches for outside the half Way House and later in the spring to construct slabbed areas for them to be placed on..

Copies of the audited Income and Expenditure account for the past year have been circulated and if anyone has any questions I will gladly try to answer them.

Can I please have a proposer and seconder that the I&E account is accepted by you the members.

The I&E Account was proposed as a true record by Pete Williams, seconded by Geoff Dutton and accepted by all present.

AGENDA ITEM 7 – APPOINTMENT OF CAPTAIN

ITEM 11 – ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

Martin Howard briefed that the committee will make 1 Tuesday & 1 Thursday per month, where possible, a 4-ball start for everyone so that Singles and Doubles Knock-Out Matches can be played during normal Seniors' competition times although Match players will not be able to take part in the competition of the day.

Martin Howard briefed that during this coming season, all competitions where all players scores their own ball, i.e. Highlighted Score Counts Double, Med/Stab etc., will have players scores entered on the Computer System by the committee in order to prepare for the new World Handicapping System and make handicap allocations as accurate as possible.
